

CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS 2002 Regulation 4(1)

**LAWFUL AUTHORITY TO CONDUCT
COMMERCIAL FILMING AND/OR
PHOTOGRAPHY ACTIVITIES**

This lawful authority is a written notice for the purposes of regulation 4(1) of the *Conservation and Land Management Regulations 2002* (the regulations) and it grants lawful authority to the person named herein as the Authority Holder to undertake commercial filming and/or photography activities in the areas specified in Schedule 1 of this lawful authority, an act that would otherwise be unlawful under the regulations.

SCHEDULE 2 COMMERCIAL FILMING AND PHOTOGRAPHY LAWFUL AUTHORITY CONDITIONS

- 1 The authorised person will contact Blackwood District 72 hours prior to undertaking any filming within the district, including on the Bibbulmun Track, Mundi Biddi or Cape-to-Cape Track.
- 2 The authorised person will only camp in designated campgrounds and will ensure bookings are made through Park Stay
- 3 The authorised person will ensure that they abide by all site safety risk signage and do not enter any cliff risk areas or overhangs to undertake filming.
- 4 The authorised person shall not, without lawful authority, access any islands in the park by motorised or non-motorised vessels. This includes Hamelin Island, Sugarloaf Rock, and the Saint Alouarn Islands (Flinders Island, Seal Island, and Square Rock).
- 5 The authorised person, employees, agents, contractors and passengers shall not feed any fauna, including stingrays, while on CALM Act land.
- 6 No equipment or structures to be set up along the tracks and all filming personnel will ensure that filming activities will not result in 'stepping off' the track and trampling vegetation.
- 7 The authorised person will ensure that filming activities will not obstruct the any trails or impede on the use of any trail by other users.
- 8 The authorised person will seek necessary permits to enter disease risk areas within the Blackwood district a minimum of 2 weeks prior to proposed entry date.
- 9 The authorised person will notify the Albany District prior to entry to National Parks and Nature reserves.
- 10 The authorised person is advised to remain on open public roads and tracks only.
- 11 The authorised person is advised that roads and tracks within The Fitzgerald River National Park maybe closed at short notice to mitigate the spread of Dieback.
- 12 The Operator shall contact Bunuba Dawangarri Aboriginal Corporation via governance@bunuba.com and development@bunuba.com to film Bunuba Parks.
- 13 The Operator shall ensure that any Aboriginal cultural content or material is developed and included only with the knowledge and written consent of the Bunuba Dawangarri Aboriginal Corporation
- 14 The Operator shall comply with any conditions set by Bunuba Dawangarri Aboriginal Corporation, including access to footage if requested.
- 15 The authorised person will make contact with the Esperance District Manager (Justin Black) prior to access (9083 2100)
- 16 The Lawful Authority holder must contact the Kununurra DBCA office prior to accessing Drysdale River National Park.
- 17 The Lawful Authority holder is not permitted to capture or publish any Aboriginal cultural content, including rock art or other cultural sites, without written consent of the relevant native title holders.
- 18 The Authority Holder shall only traverse along designated walk trails or roads and must only advertise designated clear tracks and walk trails in their publications.
- 19 The Authority Holder shall ensure that any Aboriginal cultural content or material from the Exmouth District is developed and included only with the knowledge and written consent of the Nynggulu Coast Joint Management Body. The Authority Holder shall seek consent by contacting and providing details of their activity proposal to the Nynggulu Coast Joint Management Body via exmouth@dbca.wa.gov.au at least 2 weeks before such activities or for guidance on site access/culturally sensitive areas
- 20 The Authority Holder shall contact the Whale Shark officer (whale.shark@dbca.wa.gov.au) at least 48 hours before filming on a tour in the Ningaloo Marine Park, with details of the operator used and vessel name

- 21 The Authority Holder shall not film or advertise at Nyinggulara National Park (ex Ningaloo) the Nyinggulu lighthouse, homestead, shearing shed and/or Norwegian Bay whaling station
- 22 The filming of Management tracks and the sites they lead to is not permitted
- 23 The Authority holder must not film or advertise the Cape Farquhar area from Amherst point (Warroora) to 6 mile (Gnaraloo)
- 24 The Authority Holder shall adhere to the Turtle Watching Code of Conduct attached
- 25 If filming the Gujawari (Whale Shark) the Authority Holder shall adhere to the rules set out by the Biodiversity Conservation Regulations (2018) developed for the protection of whale sharks as shown in the Interacting with Gujawari PDF attached
